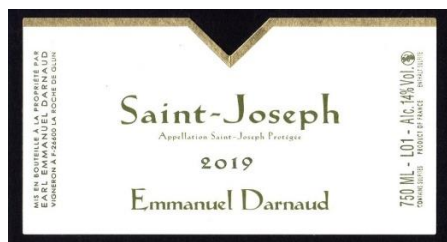

Harvest dates : September 11, 2019

Grape variety : 100 % Marsanne

ABV : 14°

Terroir : Granitic origin

Age of vines : More 30 years old

Cultivation : Ploughed soils, manual grape picking

Winemaking / ageing: Soft extraction of the juices (pneumatic pressoir), maceration and ageing in oak barrels (during 11 months)

Wine tasting : Color : Beautiful strawy colour with silvery highlights

Nose : Stylish nose. Hint of yellow fruit, of Bergeron and of bergamot but also of a mineral sensation, of wet stone or of pebble. A nose deep in structure

Palate : This wine offers an ample and generous structure and of a great purity. A racy and long wine

Pairing : This wine will be excellent with fish and white meat such as : a few scallops roasted in butter and served on a buttered endive with a little fleur de sel and a drop of pepper / a sea bass cooked in a salt crust served with a few « glazed » carrots / a tenderloin of veal gently roasted in the oven and served with a generous pan of porcini mushrooms / mornier cheese or 18 or 24 months ripened Comté

Laying down : This wine can be stored between 5 and 10 years but is already very good to drink today
